

Ordinary Time in the Church Year

It is ordinary time in the church year and will remain so until the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, the second day of March. The gospel or 'good news' read at Sunday Mass is that which St. Luke wrote and is referred to as the third gospel or the gospel of Year C. Green Vestments are worn during ordinary time and the green plants in front of the Altar in Ashbourne remind us that we are all asked to pray that we will grow in our relationship with Jesus.

Today we begin our systematic reading of the gospel of Luke as part of the Liturgy of the Word. We hear in today's gospel how the people in Jesus' home town are astonished at the claims that Jesus is making. Jesus quotes a text from the prophet Isaiah to say the spirit is upon Him and He brings good news. Every time we come together to hear the bible being read at Mass or open our bibles at home we open our ears to amazing good news.

In January of 2020 Pope Francis asked that all parishes celebrate 'Word of God' Sunday on this 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time each January. In doing so, Pope Francis is asking us to reflect on the importance of the 'Word of God' to Christians. Each Sunday the Bible is read in Christian Churches and we as followers of Jesus are asked to let the word speak to us. This is the good news of our salvation. In order to highlight the Word of God this Sunday two candles are lit each side of the Ambo.

'Do This In Memory' Mass


Today we welcome the children being prepared to receive their First Holy Communion in early May. For today's Mass the boys and girls have been learning about the offertory gifts at



Mass. They have learnt about how Bread and Wine is made and how it was a key part of Jesus' Last Supper. The people's Mass response to the blessing of the Bread and Wine is 'Blessed be God forever'. The children's art for this Mass had them colouring in bunches of grapes and sheaves of wheat. Parents are asked to talk to their children about the making of Bread and Wine and are encouraged to show them varieties of grapes and bread when out shopping. At the end of Mass children receive a gift of a Prayer Card.

Children Can Receive a Blessing at **Communion** Time

Children who have not yet received Holy Communion are welcome to come forward at communion time to receive a blessing. Parents are asked to encourage their children to cross their arms in front of them when they arrive at the communion station so that the Eucharistic Minister or priest knows to give a blessing.


Government Announcement on St. Bridget's Day
