## St. Brigid's Day – February 1<sup>st</sup>

St. Brigid's Day is on Tuesday and for many it heralds the beginning of the Irish spring and turning a back on winter. St.



d turning a back on winter. St. Brigid is the secondary patron of Ireland. Her image is now on Our Lady's altar as we reflect on her simple life of faith and generosity. It is welcome news that the government has announced that the first Monday in February each year from

2023 will be a public holiday. Many people had lobbied for this great woman to continue to be acknowledged for the role she played as a pioneer in bringing the flame of faith to many parts of our country. There is a strong tradition of children and adults in our parish making St. Brigid's crosses on her feast day.


Candlemas Day – Wednesday

On February 2<sup>nd</sup> candles are blessed at mass as Christians celebrate 40 days since Christmas Day with the marking of the feast of Jesus' presentation in the temple. If anyone would like to make a donation towards altar candles or have candles of their own they would like blessed please



bring them to mass on this day. The parish is grateful to Ollie, aka 'the candle man' who as a volunteer looks after candles and shrines in Ashbourne church. The feast of Jesus' presentation is also a day of prayer for those in religious life. Pope Francis in his monthly intentions recognizes the 'harsh obedience' that some religious followed in the past. He says that this often negated an understanding of God's abundant mercy. The diocesan celebration of religious life in our diocese will be hosted by Bishop Tom on February  $20^{\text{th}}$  at 4pm in the cathedral, Mullingar. All religious (past or present) are welcome to the occasion.

#### Feast of St Blaise – Thursday



Thursday is the Feast of St Blaise and the 10am mass will finish with the blessing of throats. St. Blaise was an early bishop and martyr of the church and is venerated as the patron of those suffering from throat disease. His remains are in Dubrovnik in Croatia where throats are blessed every day of the year.

#### First Friday Mass and Calls to the Sick

Friday next is the First Friday in February. The 10am Mass will be offered for those enrolled on the Ashbourne-Donaghmore parish list of the dead. Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciarán will do communion calls to those on the parish list on Friday of this week. If anyone is at home and cannot get to mass and wish to receive the sacrament they should contact the parish.

#### Refurbishment of the Old National School and the Presbytery

A planning application has been submitted to Meath County Council seeking the refurbishment of the presbytery on Ashbourne church grounds and works to the old national



school allowing it to become a residence for the parish priest. The footprint of both buildings will largely stay the same with proposed works including an insulation and electrical upgrade to both buildings. The plans for the old national school will replace the previous plan submitted in 2019 which proposed to extend the building to become an education centre.

#### Opening Up with Less Restrictions

Thankfully our parish can continue its efforts to open-up and return to some normality. There is no longer a requirement to have distance measures in place. So nearly all churches you visit should have every seat open again. Choirs are allowed in parishes where they exist. Collections can take place by basket again. There are no restrictions on numbers at Sunday or weekday masses. Baptisms, funerals and weddings planned in parishes can now take place as they did in pre covid times. Details around the celebration of communion and confirmation will be drawn up shortly following government protocols around keeping young people safe during covid.

#### Positive Steps in Ashbourne

As some restrictions are relaxed it is important that we still know the importance of wearing masks in church and sanitizing our hands when going and coming from worship. The parish stewards have done trojan work in difficult circumstances and please God later in the year we will be able to thank them properly. The stewards will continue to welcome people to mass, to do the collection in the new way and they will help regulate the coming up for holy communion. Our church concert with 'The Three Tenors' can go ahead on February 25<sup>th</sup> and our parish will join in the national commemoration on March 20<sup>th</sup> to pray for those who died and suffered during the co-vid break.

## Hoping That People Will Return

It is our hope and prayer that more people will return to the expressed practise of the faith in Ashbourne and Donaghmore as our country full reopens from the restrictions of co-vid. Many people, particularly young families, left attendance at mass to others so they could have safe space to attend. We want everyone to know that they are welcome and are missed. We would love to have you back and to get to know you as we endeavour to grow together in our Christian faith. Our parish community is about a real community of people growing in faith, hope and love. Online virtual masses helped during the pandemic in a limited way to connect spiritually but our parish cannot survive on an online forum. Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciaran look forward to the day when are masks can be removed and we can see one another properly and relate fully. Please God by Easter as we continue to open up and the co-vid data is on our side we may be able to have mass servers back in our church and be able to gather in the parish hall for tea after mass.

#### Second Collection at Masses Today

After holy communion today there is a collection to contribute towards the parish contribution to the diocesan cess of  $\notin$ 9,000. The money collected across parishes in Meath supports the work of church welfare agencies including Accord Catholic Marriage care, prison chaplaincy, communications office, the



National Safeguarding Board, and the Council for Immigrant and Emigrant Support. This is one of six second collections that take place annually in our parish. All those contributing are thanked for their support as are the stewards who help collect our parish offering. Mile buiochas.
