Corpus Christi Masses



Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and is often known by its Latin name 'Corpus Christi'. This feast highlights three very important things: 1) Every Sunday we

gather to celebrate Jesus. 2) The Body of Christ nourishes us. 3) As members of the church our mission is to carry out the work of Jesus in the world. As we reflect on this sacrament of Holy Communion and celebrate the Blessed Eucharist we recall the words of Vatican Council II document 'Lumen Gentium' 'the Eucharist is to be the source and summit of Christian life'.

'Walk With Christ' Procession

It is many years since Ashbourne had a Corpus Christi Procession. This evening the Parish Pastoral Assembly are organising а Eucharistic Procession in the Church grounds. This 'Walk With



Christ' will begin at 7pm. The procession will last forty minutes and end with Benediction in the Church. All are welcome to join us but we would be especially delighted to welcome children who have received the sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation this year. First Communion children are especially invited to wear their Holy

Communion clothes. All children are welcome to carry a small posie/basket of flowers for the procession. There is a cup of tea and time for a chat after the procession in the Parish Pastoral Centre.

Supporting Those Doing Exams

This Saturday evening's 7pm Mass is offered for all those interred both in Ashbourne Church Cemetery and Killegland Cemetery. The blessing of the graves will take place immediately afterwards. The graves in the church grounds will be blessed at 7.45pm. Killegland graves will be blessed at 8.15pm that same evening. The graves in Donaghmore and Greenogue are blessed this Sunday morning following the 10am Mass offered for the deceased buried in these cemeteries. As we bless the graves in Donaghmore this weekend we pray for the deceased members of the O'Connell family who fifty years ago gave the land to St. Finian's Diocesan Trust for the new cemetery that has benefited the parishioners of Donaghmore. On Saturday evening next (June 8th) the 7pm Vigil Mass will be offered for those interred in St. Declan's Cemetery with the blessing of the graves afterwards at 8.15pm. We thank parishioners and friends for joining us and all those who have their family plots looking so well as we honour our beloved dead.

Cemetery Committee Volunteers are Sought

Fr. Michael announces at cemetery devotions this weekend that he would like to see if a group of people with family plots in Ashbourne Church Cemetery would be willing to work with him to look after the cemetery. The committee would start its work at the end of September, have a three year term, apply for burial grants from the state and look at issues to do with enhancing the cemetery in Ashbourne Church grounds. It may seem that the graveyard is looking well and some things we cannot change but there is always

First Friday Mass and Calls to the Housebound Friday next is the Feast of the Sacred Heart and the First Friday of June. The 10am Mass will be offered for all those on the Ashbourne-Donaghmore Parish List of the Dead. Our priests will bring Holy Communion on Friday to those



who are housebound and wish to receive the Blessed Sacrament. Any person of faith who is unable to get to mass and would like to receive the Blessed Sacrament each month should contact the Parish Office.

Pope Francis' to Parish Priests

Pope Francis wrote a letter in recent weeks to all priests at the front line of parish ministry. In an email to all priests he says 'The Church could not go on without you'. He asks priests to build a missionary church in which all the baptised share in the mission of proclaiming and living the gospel. 'Parish communities increasingly need to become places

from which the baptised set out as missionary disciples and to which they return, full of joy, in order to share the wonders worked by the Lord through their witness'.



Relic of Blessed Hanna Chrzanowska

A relic of Blessed Hanna Chrzanowska will be present in Ashbourne Church on Tuesday morning next, June 4th. Hanna set up a care facility for the sick and poor in her Krakow parish during WWII. A friend of Pope St John Paul II she was beatified at the Shrine of the Divine Mercy in 2018. This Polish woman is the first lay nurse to be beatified and prayers will be said as a miracle is sought for her to be formally declared a saint. We thank the Guild of Catholic

Nurses for bringing this relic to Ashbourne Church on its way to a permanent home in Dominick Street Church. As part of the Mass, Ms Gosia Brykczynska, the European President of the International Guild of Catholic Nurses, will introduce Hanna's life to us and the Sacrament of the Sick will be administered. After Mass parishioners will be welcome to venerate her relic.



Parish Pastoral Assembly Meeting

The June meeting of the Parish Pastoral Assembly takes place on Tuesday evening next at 7pm in the Parish Pastoral Centre. We will review the work done so far and continue to



make pastoral plans and promote initiatives that strengthen and safeguard the faith of parishioners. Bishop Tom recently met with the Parish Priests and Chairpersons of the Parish Pastoral Assemblies in our deanery of Ratoath. All Parish Pastoral Assemblies are asked to reflect on increasing cooperation between parishes and parish clustering.

Holy Hour For Vocations on Friday Next

On Friday evening for the Feast of the Sacred Heart there will be a Vocations Holy Hour in Ashbourne Church from 7 to 8pm. It will be led by Fr. Tony Gonoude-Meath Diocesan Vocations Director. We encourage parishioners of Ashbourne and Donaghmore to support this diocesan initiative of prayer for priests. It is important especially today that we support priests and young people discerning a vocations to priesthood

or religious life. The Diocesan Vocations Team visit parishes across our diocese promoting vocations and praying for vocations. If anyone in our parish feels they have a call to priesthood and wish to do something about it they should talk to one of our priests.
