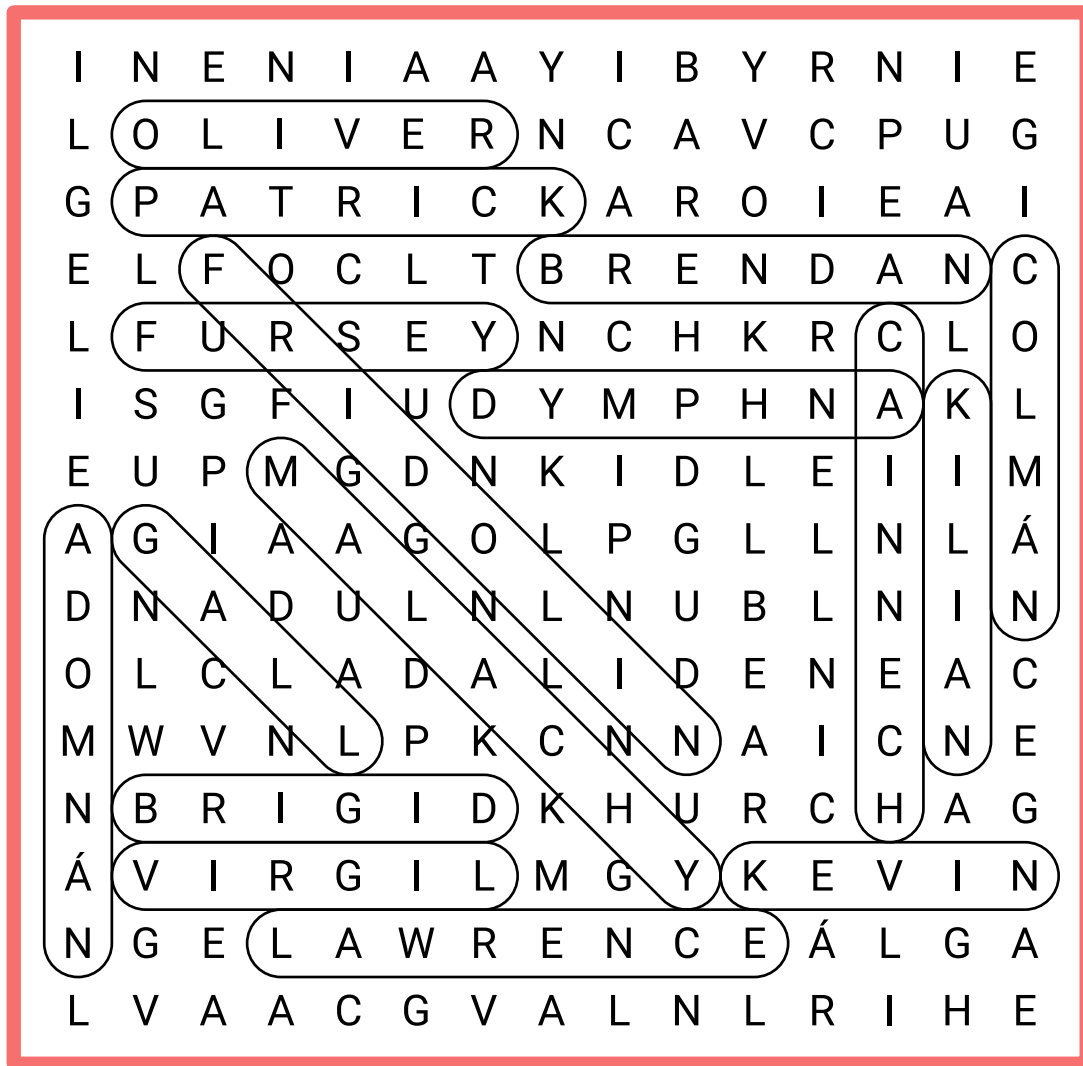

## Irish Saints Word Search (Hard)



**Adomnán:** 7th-century abbot of Iona. Biographer of Saint Columba, known for his legal reforms.

**Brendan:** Known as Brendan the Navigator. Famed for his legendary sea voyage in search of the Isle of the Blessed.

**Brigid:** One of Ireland's patron saints. Founded several monasteries and is known for her generosity and miracles.

**Cainnech:** Also known as Saint Canice. Founded the monastery at Aghaboe. Prominent figure in early Irish monasticism.

**Colmán:** Saint Colmán of Cloyne. Early Irish bishop. Founder of the diocese of Cloyne. Known for his scholarship.

**Dymphna:** Patron saint of mental illness, known for her piety and martyrdom in defense of her faith.

**Fridolin:** An Irish missionary who evangelised parts of Germany and Switzerland. Founded the Abbey of Sädingen.

**Fursey:** An early Irish missionary, founded monasteries in England and France and is known for his prophetic visions.

**Gall:** A disciple of Saint Columban, Saint Gall was a missionary who founded the Abbey of Saint Gall in Switzerland.

**Kevin:** Founder of the monastery at Glendalough, Saint Known for his ascetic life and deep connection with nature.

**Kilian:** Saint Kilian was an Irish missionary and martyr who brought Christianity to Franconia in modern-day Germany.

**Lawrence O'Toole:** The first Irish-born Archbishop of Dublin. Was known for his reform efforts and dedication to peace.

**Malachy:** Saint Malachy, Archbishop of Armagh, was known for his reforms of the Irish Church and his prophecies.

**Patrick:** The patron saint of Ireland. Is credited with converting the Irish to Christianity and is celebrated on March 17th.

**Oliver:** Saint Oliver Plunkett. Last Catholic martyr to die in England.

**Virgil:** Saint Virgil of Salzburg, an Irish missionary and bishop. Known for his astronomical and geographical knowledge
