



Christian Unity Week Ends Today

'There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling' (Ephesians 4:4)

Each year during January, leading up to the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on January 25th, Christians unite to pray and promote greater co-operation between Christians of all denominations. This year the theme is based on the biblical text 'one Spirit and one Hope' for Unity for all churches. The text was chosen by members of the Apostolic Church in Armenia which traces their Christianity back to the apostles and in 301 AD was the first nation to adopt Christianity as its state religion. In the past in our country there was much emphasis on difference rather than on similarities and regrettably Christians often did not share and celebrate their common vision. We have all heard stories of how deep divisions were and some still carry hurt and pain. Today thankfully Catholics, Church of Ireland members, Methodists and Presbyterians emphasize the person of Christ at the heart of their lives. Today at all our Masses we pray the Eucharistic Prayer for Christian Unity.

Postures During Mass

As part of a three week explanation by the Parish Pastoral Council of the postures we adopt at Sunday Mass this week we explain what happens when we sit down in the pew.

Sitting is a posture of attentive listening and receptivity. We sit to receive and hear God's Word and to meditate on it. We listen to God speaking to us. It shows that we are ready to be taught and nourished by the Word before responding in prayer and action. At Sunday Mass we are seated for the First Reading, Responsorial Psalm and Second Reading. We sit for the Preparation and Offering of the Gifts (Offertory). We sit also for the Notices before the Final Blessing and Dismissal. Next weekend we will lastly look at what we do when we kneel.



Pilgrimage to the Shrines of Southern France

Fr. Michael will lead a pilgrimage to the Shrines of Southern



France from Wednesday May 27th to June 3rd. The itinerary will take in the two main Marian Shrines in France, namely Lourdes and La Salette. The pilgrimage will also take in the Papal Basilica of Avignon and the mountain basilica of Rocamadour. The seven day

Unlike our mobile phone, we don't have to worry about our Bible being disconnected because our Lord in heaven has already paid the bill ...


Celebrating the Sacraments



Confirmation: There will be two ceremonies led by Bishop Tom on Saturday, 28 February at 11am and 2pm. **1st Holy Communion Weekends** On Saturday the 9th, 16th and 23rd of May children will receive Holy communion with their families as guests of honour at the Sunday Mass. **1st Confession:** From 4 to 6pm on Saturdays March 7, 21, 28 when parents bring their children to the sacrament that celebrates the importance of forgiveness.

Request for Sacraments

All sacraments for children must be requested by a parent or next of kin taking responsibility for the handing on of faith. If you are a parent who wish to prepare your child for baptism, confession, communion or confirmation you are reminded that your child must be registered with the Parish Office. Just because a child is in a certain class in a school presumption of a sacrament is never made without parental consent and commitment to the Christian faith. At this time Catholic parents with children in first class in our parish schools are invited to put their child forward for reception of the sacrament of confession.
